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### HOW THE POLL WAS CONDUCTED

**This poll was conducted by Mason-Dixon Polling & Strategy, Inc. of Jacksonville, Florida from April 9 through April 11, 2019. A total of 625 registered Alabama voters were interviewed statewide by telephone.**

**Those interviewed were randomly selected from a phone-matched Alabama voter registration list that included both land-line and cell phone numbers. Quotas were assigned to reflect voter registration by county.**

**The margin for error, according to standards customarily used by statisticians, is no more than  $\pm 4$  percentage points. This means that there is a 95 percent probability that the "true" figure would fall within that range if all voters were surveyed. The margin for error is higher for any subgroup, such as a gender or age grouping.**

**QUESTION: How do you feel about the amount of renewable energy currently being utilized in Alabama? Do you feel the state is using enough renewable energy, not using enough renewable energy, or is using more than enough renewable energy?**
